Entry will be free for cars and the public, we are not doing this to make money, our focus is to showcase as many vehicles as possible.

Events like these need people to play a part for them to be successful. Below is a high-level list of the tasks that will need to organised and run:

Promotions – preparation of materials to send to the other clubs, the media, motoring associations. Press releases to the motoring press and other local and state media outlets to raise interest.

Venue preparation – we have booked the venue for the entire weekend so the plan is to do the setup on the Saturday so we can make the most of the day on the Sunday.

Catering – we will know numbers as the year progresses, but we do know there will be a reasonable number from Victoria so having the food available throughout the day will be critical. Loaned BBQs, portable fridges etc. will also be needed.

Judging – we will need a group of knowledgeable people to undertake the judging activities. Categories will be decided over time but will span commercial, pre 50s, post 50s cars, vans etc.

Administration – Good logistics and project management will be critical to make this event work as well as it can. Activities such as registration of entrants, answering queries from potential entrants, dealing with trade and industry reps are just a few to name at this stage. Ideally it would be great to have small teams working on the other social and children related activities to be sure each activity is run as well as possible.

The Irishman, the Englishman and the Australian

Part 3 – The end of BMC

Herbert Austin missed out on buying Wolseley in 1927. Ultimately, though, Austin and Morris merged in 1952.

By this time, Austin had passed away (in 1941), so unfortunately, was not there to see Wolseley become part of the same company the Austin car company was part of.

By the time of the merger, Leonard Lord was running Austin. William Morris was still in charge at Morris and agreed to run the then new BMC for the first year, before retiring. He passed away in 1963.

Morris, Austin and Wolseley were all trailblazers in the motor industry in their own right. They should be considered in the same light as Steve Jobs, Bill Gates, Jeff Bezos and co. In the same way, they were at the cutting edge of new technology and followed their dreams to great success.

But did these companies really die? Their auto manufacturing wings certainly did, but in some ways they are still alive. For example, Wolseley is now the world's largest distributor of heating and plumbing products.

In the same way, the Armstrong Siddeley name continues as Hawker Siddeley and now renamed as British Aerospace (BAE systems).

Wolseley and Austin both had close ties to Australia and perhaps if they had moved to Australia after federation, may have become Australian citizens. As it was, they lived a large part of their lives in Victoria and NSW.

William Morris also had a fondness for Australia and Morris cars were very popular in Australia.

Although many people consider Holden and Ford to be Australian companies, both companies have their roots in the USA. Now, neither company manufactures in Australia.

Austin, Morris and Wolseley manufactured cars in Australia for many years, with local input into design to suit local conditions. They should be considered in the same light as GMH and Ford.

There are not the same ties between Walter Chrysler, Henry Ford, Louis Chevrolet or William Durant and Australia as there are with Wolseley. Morris and Austin.

Meeting point: Westgate Park,. Entry to the park off Todd Road. For those of you who still like to use Melways, the reference is 56 F1.










21st-22nd
